13.	Permanently fitted Radar Reflector of at least 400 mm – ONLY power driven vessels of 9 m or more operating west of Port Alfred. (SAMSA Recommended for all offshore voyages)					
14.	Marine VHF or 29 MHz radio to be fitted – VHF to have at least channel 16 and one other working channel, 29 MHz to have channels A,B and C. License No:					
15.	Depth sound device or hand lead line (only on Dive Boats)					
16.	Steering Magnetic compass (with illumination for night operation.)

18.	Grabline fitted to outside of Gunwhale (only on Dive Boats except where fitted with a boarding ladder).					
20.	Capsize Rope for use when vessel is inverted (ONLY on inflatable and ski-boats less than 9 metres in length).					
21.	Suitable sea-anchor, fitted with hawser and tripping line (rigged and ready for use). ONLY required on surf launched vessel of less than 9 m in length).					
22.	Proper patent anchor and chain with a suitable length of rope for the area of operation.					
23.	Watertight capsized bottle attached to vessel with rope readily accessible in event of capsized. (Containing flares, survival and emergency equipment).					
24.	Space Blankets x 2.					
25.	Drinking water – ONE litre per person.					
26.	First-Aid Kit Suitable for vessel size, compliment intended operation. Elementary First Aid Manual.
